

Carriage of Un-accompanied Young Persons Policy

This policy will take effect from Sunday 1st January 2012

- 1.1 The Company will not accept for travel on board any Company operated vessel any un-accompanied young person under the age of twelve years.
- 1.2 Any person under the age of twelve years must be accompanied by an adult whilst travelling on any Company operated vessel, an adult for these purposes being any person at least sixteen years old.
- 1.3 Exceptions will be made for children aged eleven where travel has been arranged by the Council's Education, Leisure and Housing Services, and where the express consent of the Marine Services and the child's parents/legal guardians has been obtained by the Executive Director of Education, Leisure and Housing Services prior to travel.



TURBINE REPORT

For those still unaware, we are pleased to announce that the 900 kW turbine on Kingarly Hill is now commissioned and has been operational for nearly two months at time of writing [Dec 20th]. During this first period there has been a normal period of snagging and bedding down, but also significant real production.

During its first 28 days of operation, the community turbine on Kingarly Hill fed 400 MWh [megawatt-hours] of electrical energy into the grid. This is 400,000 kWh or what we ordinarily refer to as Units of electricity. During this initial period the turbine had few stoppages but still produced, on average, 67% of its maximum rated output of 900kW – an outstanding performance.

Since this early “honeymoon period” we have had some issues. For the turbine to be able to produce electricity and pass it into the grid network, it must not only be windy but **all** of the following conditions must also be met:

- the RPZ [Renewables Priority Zone] grid network has to be fully functioning;
- the dedicated BT telephone link with the Kirkwall power station must be working or the turbine is automatically switched out from the grid;
- there must be a mains electricity supply **into** the turbine.

Unfortunately, during the next weeks, one or more of the above conditions were **not** met for much of the time. There were initial problems of reliability with the BT line. Then a lightning strike put the whole of the RPZ network out of action across Orkney. It then transpired that SSE's electronic equipment connecting the turbine to the grid had also been damaged by the lightning strike. Further lightning strikes damaged BT equipment and then, the following week, extreme winds brought down Rousay power lines; causing a power outage to the whole island. Also, in an unrelated incident, the total BT cable to Sourin failed.

Though we were not expecting so many at the same time, we were told to expect all these types of issues as part of the normal challenges of operating a turbine. Despite all these events, the turbine has actually still produced a further 250-odd MWh of electricity in this second month; a figure almost exactly on target for the average projected monthly production in our business plan.

We should like to thank our own employees [Michelle as Turbine Development Officer plus Jess and Richard as Turbine Responders], Mark [a director and CES officer for Orkney] and Norman [for SSE] who, in conjunction with staff from Enercon [the turbine manufacturers], Scottish and Southern Electricity and BT, spent many hours, often in extreme conditions and at inconvenient times, identifying and rectifying all these problems. We have learnt a great deal over this period, but are very much hoping to return to a more stable situation in the coming weeks.

Allotment news

Work has now taken place inside the polytunnel to level the ground, backfill the edges and apply a matted covering to the ground to control weeds. There is a central path and plots are marked out. Unfortunately the polytunnel frame has suffered some storm damage, so temporary reinforcement inside the tunnel has been erected, hopefully to hold until the better weather returns in the New Year. Then we can redesign the ends of the frame to withstand our Orkney weather!



I have attended a course of lectures to gain knowledge and information about growing in polytunnels in Orkney, which have proved interesting, with lots of relevant information to share with members at meetings next year.

The AGM for the Rousay Allotment Association will be held on Wednesday 25th January 2012 at 8.00pm at The Manse. It is hoped that all existing members are able to attend as we will be forming a committee to plan next years' meetings. There are still some plots available at £20 a year for a double plot (less than 40 pence a week) or a polytunnel plot at £10 a year.
