Ferry tickets available for children attending activities







The Rousay School Parent Council has received funding secured by The REW Development Trust from the Big Lottery which will allow us to provide ferry tickets to children and an accompanying adult who are travelling to activities. This includes children under school age and children up to age 18 while in full time education.

These tickets could be used, for example, to attend weekly, planned activities such as music lessons or sports training, or for less regular trips to the swimming pool or to sports or music activities.

Families can receive books of tickets up front, which are issued in the name of The Parent Council and are valid for 1 year. To ensure that tickets are being used for the required purpose and to satisfy the conditions of the Development Trust, we will ask that parents provide a note of the dates travelled along with receipts showing that children have taken part in an activity for each date shown. Where tickets are used for regular weekly activities we would ask for a note signed by an activity organiser or administrator for each term or block of attendance. On production of the above, new books of tickets can be issued.

Thank you to all those who turned up on a very blustery day for the opening ceremony and especially to the children from the Rousay school who walked up to the turbine at an impressive speed and whose contribution made the event such a memorable one. The plaque, the time capsule and the circle of hands around the base of the turbine are now all in place.

Diamond Jubilee Party

The Trust is pleased to report that the Rousay Community Association has offered to organise this event on behalf of the community on all three islands.

AGM

In a crowded events diary for the month of June, there is an available slot for the Trust's 2012 AGM on the morning of Saturday June 16th at 10.15 a.m. [thus making it readily possible for residents of Egilsay and Wyre to attend]. Further details will be circulated nearer to the date. Members of the Trust interested in becoming directors [and so being actively involved in decisions about how turbine income should be deployed in light of the current community survey] are reminded that they should send a signed letter declaring their interest to the Trust office not less than 7 days prior to the AGM.

REWDT Grants

We are pleased to have already received applicants for grants although disposable income from the Kingarly Hill turbine will not become available until the autumn. Decisions about which of a number of possible projects for which we are permitted to use remaining BIG lottery funds will be made in the light of the outcomes of the on-going community survey.

Community Broadband facilities

By the time this edition of the Review is published, Wi Fi aerials should have been installed at all three locations so we are hoping that the Broadband signal for each community facility will be optimised. Further details of the free assistance with using e-mails, accessing the internet, etc. are provided in a separate item in this Review.

Turbine Report [from our trading subsidiary REWIRED]

Total production since commissioning reached 2 GWh [gigawatt-hours] on 18th April [i.e. after 6 months].

1GWh is a million kWh [kilowatt-hours or Units].

During the last complete month [March]	Since commissioning in Oct 2011
42.24% of its rated capacity	51.31% of its rated capacity

[Our financial model, which will provide a net annual income of around £100,000, is based on a productivity of **37%** of rated capacity. The low productivity for March was due to our turbine being curtailed for around 20% of the time because of the grid being overloaded. Ways of mitigating this problem are currently being investigated.]

Polytunnel News

The polytunnel is now beginning to show signs of growth, with strawberry plants already flowering, tomatoes, herbs, cabbages, onions, peas, horseradish, lettuce and flower seedlings popping up on members' plots. It is really exciting to see how well things are growing with the shelter of the polytunnel out of our Orkney wind!

Water

Hopefully we will be able to erect some guttering around the shed to collect rain water this month.

A.G.M.

The A.G.M. has been arranged for 23rd May at 8pm at The Manse. After the official business we are having a Rousay Gardener's Question Time with a panel of local gardeners to share their local knowledge with those of us who are new to gardening on Rousay. If you would like to join the fun write your question out ready for the panel and hopefully we can all learn something about growing in Orkney.

Everyone is welcome. Refreshments will be served.

Membership and fees

Membership fees for allotment plots and polytunnel spaces are now due on 1^{st} May. You can pay at the A.G.M. on 23^{rd} May or pop into the Trust Office at The Manse.

Plots are £20 a year for a double plot (less than 40 pence a week) or a polytunnel space at £10 a year. (If you paid last year for your polytunnel space, this year is free)

Associate membership

Many residents have joined The Rousay Allotment Association to take advantage of the cheap compost we have had delivered at the allotments. Good quality compost is available for members to collect at 25p a bag (bring your own bag). You can put the money in to me at 7 Pier Houses or pay at the Trust office. We also have seed plug trays, pots, canes and string available on request. Associate membership is £5 a year. You can also hire the strimmer or rotovator for £10 for 24 hours and we hope to purchase a petrol hedge trimmer for hire soon.

Money saving tip

Recycle your old flower pots - but first it is important to clean them thoroughly as disease can spread into new seedlings. After you have had a bath, soak your old pots in the bathwater, giving them a good scrub. This saves both water and money to buy new pots.

Growing tips for May

Repot tomato and pepper plants, thin out lettuce seedlings and keep watering you seeds. It is surprising how quickly things dry out if you don't keep an eye on them!

Free seeds

There are still some free seeds available from Community Powerdown who funded the allotment project. There are carrots, radish, lettuce and cabbage. If you would like some packets then let me know.

If you do not have a computer or internet connection I can pick you up and take you to the community facilities or some other location of your choice if you are unable to get there.


Just some of the training available:-



Volunteer Emergency Responders

The Scottish Ambulance Service are looking for Volunteers to become Emergency Responders.

The Responders would be trained to deal with certain emergency situations and act as support for Dr Brunt and the Community Nurses. The Training involves CPR, use of the defibrillator and Oxygen therapy as well as how to deal with common medical emergencies. The Responder groups are given a Response bag, oxygen cylinder and a defibrillator, and would get regular refresher sessions and support from local Paramedics.

We are particularly looking for people in Egilsay and Wyre to volunteer but Rousay residents are also invited to join the existing group on the island.
