

# Heritage at Risk—

## High Rochester Roman Fort

The Roman Fort at High Rochester was for two centuries the northernmost fort of the Roman Empire and is one of the best preserved archaeological sites within Northumberland National Park.

The aim of this project is to conserve the structure of the Fort, a Scheduled Monument, by removing risks to the fabric and improving the visual amenity of the monument. Repair and consolidation works to the Fort will be carried out September-October 2018, saving the fort walls from further deterioration and collapse.

Interpretation of the site will also be enhanced, including the production of a leaflet, interpretation panel and a digital i-beacon that will help visitors re-construct the site and provide further information about the Romans in Redesdale.
