10.	<p>Reports</p> <p>a) County Councillor's Report</p> <p>Work to persuade Highways England of the many merits of a route to the north of Oxford for the Oxford to Cambridge Expressway continues. We have had sight of a letter from the Chancellor of the Exchequer which shows that in some quarters, at least, they are lobbying and it seems to be sinking in. In particular, it notes the merits of trying to link the Expressway to the A420, which would necessarily take the route north of Oxford.</p> <p>OCC has set up a new Innovation Fund (with a total of £100,000). This fund forms part of the Council's approach to ensuring that people have access to a variety of activities and support during their daily lives. The Council wants to encourage as many organisations as possible to apply, to enable the creation of varied and innovative support to meet people's changing needs and the different opportunities that they would like to see available to them. The deadline for applications is 8th June. This is not aimed at supporting current activities, but helping to set up new ones.
