<b>What historic sites are in the Parish?</b> Settlements – Dunmere and Pencarrow Celtic Cross at Cross Hill Grade I Listed Church Significant properties	Contact Steve Hartgroves, Cornwall Council. Find out what the historic sites of the Parish are? Determine what should be protected Determine whether the Parish feel is primarily historical, primarily modern, or a combination of both coming together.
<b>Are the historic sites being looked after properly? Are they easy to access and well presented to the public?</b> Historic and archaeological sites are monitored by Cornwall Archaeological Society, which has area representatives.	A first step would be to contact Roger Smith the representative for St Mabyn. What historic sites do we want to highlight, feature, celebrate?
<b>How better might they be preserved and presented?</b> Visible monuments will probably be checked regularly by the Cornwall Archaeological Society Area Representative but there will also be below ground archaeology.	First step – check County Council Sites and Monuments Record which is publicly available on line. What is already protected?
