

Minutes of the Meeting of Sutton under Whitestonecliffe Parish Council held at 7.15pm in Sutton Village Hall on Monday September 10th 2018.

- 18.141 Apologies for absence were received and accepted from Cllrs. C. Artingstoll, T. Hill and G. Thomas. County Councillor G. Dadd was unable to attend and sent his apologies. Councillor Worley chaired the meeting.
- 18.142 There was no report from NY Police.
- 18.143 Declaration of interest in items on the agenda. None.

- 18.149 Planning Matters:

- 18.150 The Traffic Management Sub Committee had met and put together the PCC Community Fund application. The form filling will be finalised on 18th September and then be sent to Cllr. Dadd for a further review. The next Sutton Bank meeting with NYCC and the Deputy PCC is on Friday 12th October and Cllr. Dickinson will attend. The PCC fund application will be discussed and subject to there being no further amendments it will be submitted by Cllr. Dadd to the PCC. The PC has been asked to make a contribution of £1000 to the Variable Message Sign project. As yet no information regarding other parishes that have made a contribution to Highways projects has been received. The request for £1000 will be discussed and voted on at the October PC meeting.
- 18.151 Cllr. A. Pollard reported about recent traffic incidents in the village and on Sutton Bank. On 23rd August a caravan had got stuck trying to turn around at the junction of Thirlby Road and the A170, causing long tailbacks of traffic. On 24th August three cars had collided at the battlements, resulting in one vehicle demolishing part of the wall belonging to West Farm and then overturning. This again had caused severe traffic holdups. Cllr. Artingstoll had asked NYCC to check if the battlements were in a sound condition and if the white lining was adequate. Both answers were affirmative but the Parish Councillors felt that the white lining at the crash site was inadequate, especially at times of low sun and rain. A lorry had shed its load of meat on Sutton Bank and there had been numerous reports of straying sheep on the A170.
- 18.152 Arrangements to progress the Emergency plan were made.
- 18.153 There had been no progress in the co-option of a new Parish Councillor. The vacancy would be mentioned in the next newsletter.
- 18.154 Work was underway on the repair of Village Name Millstone.
- 18.155 The Allerton Park Waste Incinerator visit had been put on hold following the fourth change of date. Contact would be made in the future once their teething problems had been sorted out.
- 18.156 The dog fouling culprits outside Sutton Hall had been identified and requested to bin the poo. No action would be taken at this stage. No Fouling signs had been placed around the village and down the footpath to the side of Eden House.

- 18.157 The TdY Film Night had been greatly enjoyed by those who had attended. Unused red wine would be used for the mulled wine at the Carol Singing and the white wine would be donated to the Village Hall for either the Christmas Dinner or raffle prizes.
- 18.158 Cllr. A. Pollard would represent the Parish Council at the YLCA One Day Conference on 28th September at York.
- 18.159 NYCC would be asked to remind the farm owner about the problems and dangers of stones spilling off the lane onto the road between the crabmill and the Village Hall. It was also hoped NYCC might sweep the road as they would have equipment in the area from work on Sutton Bank.
- 18.160 Arrangements were commenced for the compilation and distribution of the invitation for the Defibrillator Training session on 20th October at 2.30pm. The letter would be distributed two weeks before the event. Refreshments would be supplied by Cllr. Artingstoll. Cllr. A. Pollard would arrange a new Defib checking rota. She also agreed to contact the supplier of the cabinet as water was collecting inside it.
- 18.161 Cllr. C. Worley would review the grit/salt bins in readiness for the winter season.
- 18.162 Christmas arrangements for the Annual Carols Around the Tree, were commenced for 4.30pm on 16th December.
