

Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding

Total fund allocated: £16,000 + £10 per pupil on roll (123 as of 6.9.17 so £1230)

The desired 5 key outcomes from this funding are:

- 1 - The engagement of all pupils in physical activity;
- 2 - The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school;
- 3 - Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4 - Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils;
- 5 - Increased participation in competitive sport.
