

**Minutes of the MEETING of STANTON ON THE WOLDS Parish Council

at The Parish Church, Stanton on the Wolds**

- 1] APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE Coun. Mrs Angela Benney.
- 2] DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST There were none
- 3] MINUTES FROM PREVIOUS MEETING held on September 10 2014 were accepted as presented and signed by the chairman.
- 4] CLERK'S REPORT FROM PREVIOUS MEETING  
The clerk said the current Notice boards had been purchased by the council in 2002 for £887. The firm, Filcris Ltd of Hertfordshire, no longer supply notice boards. The information had been collected by the clerk following comments that the plastic material on the current ones had become tainted and was no longer easy to read through. Coun. Whitby was to make contact with someone at Keyworth who was to make a board for the allotment site there. The clerk would obtain prices for other boards.
- 5] CORRESPONDENCE  
Local Government Boundary Commission, advised of its electoral review of Nottinghamshire. Members had been given copies of the information to allow them to make personal comments if they wished.  
Grant Thornton, advised the audit for 2013-14 had been approved.  
The clerk reminded members that the Notts ALC annual meeting was being held at Woodborough Village Hall November 15. The chairman said he would hope to attend.  
Notts County Council advised of its new Supporting Local Communities (SLC) Fund which had replaced the Local Improvement Scheme (LIS).  
Notts County Council wrote in regard to extinguishment of a small section of footpath 7 which had mistakenly not been deleted previously.  
BT wrote in regard to the Telephone Kiosk on Melton Road and said Community Heartbeat Trust were looking to provide a defibrillator unit for it. The council agreed it wished to proceed to use the kiosk for a defibrillator machine. The clerk pointed out there would be a cost for power to the kiosk and the question of outside lighting for it would need to be considered.
- 6] PLANNING MATTERS  
Rushcliffe Borough Council planning applications  
14/01518/ful Mrs Tina Hackett, 154 Melton Road. Extensions and alterations. Do no object.  
14/02188/ful. Mrs S Dean, Foxcote Farm, Melton Road. Change of use and extension of existing barn to single dwelling and detached double garage (revised scheme). Do not object.  
14/01790/ful. S Varley, 61 Stanton Lane. Erect 5 bedroomed replacement dwelling with double garage. Demolition of existing dwelling and ancillary buildings. Object.  
The new plans go somewhat towards the major objections we had to privacy. However we have considerable sympathy with the immediate neighbours in that not only is the property a revolutionary design it is also such a dominant structure being three stories high and flat roofed. There must be some compromise to satisfy the desire for new design with local compatibility.

7] VILLAGE AMENITIES / ENVIRONMENT/CENTENARY WORLD WAR 1/NEW BENCH

The clerk was asked to obtain prices for a wooden bench to be sited on land at the front of the garage site on Melton Road.

The chairman said he would be planting more poppy seeds in the village, and commented those already planted did not seem to have taken as well as hoped.

Coun. Whitby said he would be willing to organise a CPR training course for the village and it was agreed this should proceed and any costs involved be paid by the council. The chairman said he was sure the Golf Club would be happy to make their premises available for it.

8] DEFIBRILLATOR UNIT

No further comments were made on this item.

9] FINANCIAL MATTERS

Cheques for Payment were approved as per the circulated list.

10] WEBSITE

The council agreed that the clerk should obtain prices for design and provision of a new modern style website and for prices for running it.

11] NEWSLETTER

It was agreed that the next issue of the Newsletter be published in early December. Items to be included would be the CPR course suggestion, Neighbourhood Watch news, an item from Keyworth Medical Centre, an item on footpaths and the suggestion that Stanton should the following year have a village Christmas card.
