The main cause for concern is vehicle crime in the Debdale Lane, Nottingham Road and Church Drive area of Keyworth during September.

As always please be vigilant to suspicious incidents or people in your area and report to the Police on 999 or 101.

All reports of crime should be made by using the 999 or 101 system to report the incident to the force control room. The beat team monitor all calls to the Police involving our area and we attend those incidents that we need to.

Crime prevention event

I wish to pass my thanks onto Barbara from the Tollerton Neighbourhood Watch team; she assisted the beat team by supplying and attending the Parish Rooms on Saturday 26/09/2015 for a crime prevention event.

The event was well publicised and a significant number of residents attended to have their cycles marked with cremark and to also log their valuable items onto the Immobilise system. Both the Cremark and immobilise systems help prevent the theft of items or the return of property to the owner should they be stolen; they can be found on the internet and can be accessed by anyone.

The event was also supported by Rushcliffe Borough Council, who supplied the equipment along with the 'swap a lock' cycle lock scheme.

Inconsiderate Parking

I have been asked by a local borough councillor on my area to advise about inconsiderate parking, particularly in Keyworth.

It is an offence to park a motor vehicle on the pavement and cause an obstruction, which prevents wheelchair or children's push chairs from passing on the pavement. Fixed penalty tickets can be issued where obstructions of the footpath or peoples drives are caused.

Many issues are also reported around schools in relation to parking. Please respect the Zig Zag lines outside schools; again tickets can be issued for parking/stopping on those lines.

Also please ensure that residents' driveways are not blocked and consideration is made in respect of parking near junctions and on bus routes.
