### Scoring Notes:

**Log checking** was carried out by converting logs to Cabrillo format, and cross-checking all contacts using WT4I software. Most Cabrillo logs received were not usable without individual reformatting, due to problems with WF1B, Writelog and MMTTY contest software (which will hopefully be resolved before next year). Together with standard electronic logs, approximately 300 logs were converted to Cabrillo or rejected due to missing QSO exchange information (serial numbers, times etc.). Most of the rejections could have been avoided if the senders had read the contest rules and checked to see if all the required information was actually in their entries. The 49 rejected logs are shown with submitted check logs in the above list.

**Total and Valid contacts.** The difference between these numbers comes from contacts rejected during checking. These may be duplicates, contacts not shown in the other station's log or typing errors in logging the received exchange or call. If an excessive number of "uniques" is found these may also be marked as invalid.

**Unique calls** may require some explanation. A master call database of about 1500 callsigns is extracted from the logs received, made up of all the received callsigns logged more than once. Each log is cross-checked against this list and the amount of "uniques" can be seen. These are contacts with a station that appears in no other log. The amount of uniques will vary greatly between logs; for instance a rare DX station may log many unique calls giving "001" serial numbers. However, a large amount of uniques may show up as a result of careless logging, equipment problems or other reasons. An average log might show around 3% uniques of which half will be obvious typing errors ( GOPCA instead of G0PCA, or GW4SKB for GW4SKA), and many logs will have less than 1%. Further checks are also made against a database of all known RTTY contesters, looking for exact or close match of callsigns. If the log still shows a long list of calls previously unknown to the world of RTTY contesting they will be marked as invalid and the log may be disqualified.

**Bob AK6R:** First Time for me - what a blast - can't wait until next year!  
(another first-timer in the top 5 .. what am I doing wrong?? SKA)

**Arne KF6EDK:** A lot of new Contesters made the contest very enjoyable, predicting lot of activity in the future! Welcome all!

**Tom KE4KWE:** I do not believe Africa exists.

**Lauren KE6YTW:** My first solo rtty contest. I am 13 years old and hope to compete in many more rtty contests.

**Don KF2XF:** Best effort ever. Loads of activity and fun for me. My daughter showed enough interest to start researching licensing.

**George W1ZT:** Excellent conditions and lots of activity. Snow damaged antenna was repaired hours before the contest. Picking the "right" 30 hours was a challenge.

**Don WN1OTV:** Only worked a few hours. Propagation in the north-east was not good. Hunted rabbits on Saturday. New radio with new hookup was not the way to try a new contest. I'll be back next year.

**David WW2R:** On a road trip so used a Uniden 2510 "CB" set at 25W to a dipole on the apartment balcony. Do I really need the FT1000MP at the home QTH if it gives me these QSOs! *(175 QSOs in 6 continents on 10m .. not too bad !!)*

**Wayne W2WK:** Poor conditons for most of the test from Western NY. 80M really needs more activity from stateside stations.

**Bob ZL2AMI:** Propagation conditions forced a re-think of my operations plan and the rest period requirements added drama. Good to see strong support from BARTG members more G, GW, GM, GI, GU etc stations worked this time around. I thoroughly enjoyed the contest, thanks BARTG.

**Dick KSOM:** It was a real chore to operate the contest with the beam lashed to the tower up 3 meters. The dipole was up 2 meters and the 400 ohm feedline was on the ground. *(at least you had a beam, unlike some .....)*

**Arunas LY2IJ:** Power Output: from 10 up to 100 watts from IC-746 depending on RFI level.

Antennas: 3.5m vertical wire at balcony. Last night - 5.5m of wire attached to fishing rod put out of the same balcony.

### **Contest Manager's Notes**

Another good year for our big contest with entries up again and scores much the same as we saw in last year's excellent conditions. Competition was especially close at the top of the single operator classes, where careful planning of operating times is very important. Once again the standard of logs from the top stations was very good, but I was very sad to see so many others relegated to the check log file. Too many operators take it for granted that their software will do everything for them, and send the log in without any further reading and checking. Even worse for me was the disqualification of 3 stations. We have made a huge leap forward in the accuracy of checking logs, and especially the ability to analyse the validity of the contents, which inevitably shows up both good and bad.

Thanks for your comments and suggestions which are all read and considered. Several stations asked for the five minute band change rule to be introduced in this contest as well as the Sprint, and that will happen next year (but only for class 2 entrants). All logs for both 2002 contests will have to be submitted in Cabrillo format, with a special exception for the four stations who submitted hand written or typed logs this year (and who have all supported our BARTG contests for many years).

Congratulations to everyone who achieved their goals this year and thanks for your support. See you next year.
