

**Minutes of a Meeting of Plumtree Parish Council held on Monday November 26, 2018,

- 1] APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE There were none
- 2] DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST There were none
- 3] MINUTES FROM PREVIOUS MEETING ON SEPTEMBER 24, 2018 were accepted as presented and approved
- 4] PARISHIONERS REPORTS
No items were raised
- 5] CLERK'S REPORT AND UPDATE ON PREVIOUS MEETING BUSINESS
The chairman spoke of the success of the WW1 events on November 11. and said there had been warm community spirit. The morning service had been with a full church and the numbers turning out for the evening were high, with a good influx from Normanton on the Wolds. The meeting gave thanks to Fiona Carruthers and husband Les for their tremendous work in connection to the event and their research which resulted in a superb collections of laminated sheets giving the history of those from Plumtree who served in WW1 and of those who didn't make it back.
- 6] REPORT FROM THE BOROUGH AND COUNTY COUNCIL MEMBER
Coun. Mason commented on the success of the WW1 event. She spoke of the Borough plan for a crematorium at Stragglethorpe. The Borough tree scheme had been a success. There were just a few trees currently still available.
Coun. Cottee said he had spoken to the annual meeting of NALC on highway matters. He advised the Council were in the progress of purchasing two additional library service vehicles to confirm their commitment to the service itself. The position of road repairs was progressing but they feared a bad weather winter. He spoke of housing development planned for Keyworth.
- 7] CORRESPONDENCE
Coun. John Cottee provided details of proposed work on Main Road and other areas of the village, saying he had made the necessary requests for them to be considered.
Jo Sheppard, Notts County Council, advised that the village had been judged as the winner in Rushcliffe for decorations that had been displayed in the village for the Tour of Britain.
Mike Clark on behalf of Burnside Hall, wrote asking for consideration of a grant [to help pay for the provision of a grant] towards the cost of wall brackets in order Christmas trees and other decorations might be displayed outside the premises. The council agreed to give £50.
